


Rule Review: In the previous example, remember, the wordsigns for; be, his, was, and were, cannot be in contact with any lower punctuation, EVEN IF the presence of typeform indicators contain an upper dot to what would otherwise be a sequence with all lower dots.

Typeform indicator should be used to show *distinction* when using special typeface in print for:

- Foreign words or phrases
- Proper nouns such as names of ships, books, pictures, etc.
- Subject headings at the beginning of paragraphs
- Passages not enclosed in quotation marks that are printed in a type different from that next to certain text.

Example:

The house is going to be on sale in the *month of June* or is it?
