Period or Decimal, Question Mark, Exclamation Point, Comma, Semicolon, Colon

HINT: If a capitalized passage ends with a mark of punctuation, place the capitals terminator after the punctuation.

Learn the Following Punctuation Signs

period or decimal. : (dots 256)
question mark? : (dots 236)
exclamation point! : (dots 235)
comma, : (dot 2)
semicolon; : (dots 23)
colon: : (dots 25)
opening parenthesis (: : (dots 5, 126)
closing parenthesis) : : (dots 5, 345)
apostrophe '[or]' : (dot 3)
opening quotation mark " : (dots 236)
closing quotation mark " : (dots 356)

Numbers with Punctuation

The effect of the numeric indicator. The effect of the numeric indicator is <u>not terminated</u> by intervening <u>commas</u> or <u>decimal points</u>. However, the numeric indicator must be repeated in numbers that immediately follow colons, hyphens, or dashes.

Switching gears for a moment...

One additional learning point to remember, the <u>capitalized</u> <u>word indicator</u> is STOPPED by a space, a single capital letter, a nonalphabetic symbol [e.g. punctuation], or a capitals terminator. In your homework for Lesson 6, you will need to correctly transcribe an example like the example below.

EXAMPLE:

MAX'S dog [In this example, the apostrophe, nonalphabetic symbol, stopped the effect of the <u>capitalized word indicator</u> ... so the <u>capitalized symbol indicator</u> ... will now be used to capitalize the letter s.]
