## Weekly Dose Apostrophe with Dot 6

A capital indicator (dot 6) is ALWAYS, placed right before [next to] the letter to which it applies. Therefore, if an apostrophe comes before a capital letter in print, the apostrophe is brailled before the capital indicator.

## **EXAMPLE**

Your teacher Mr. O'Reilly is coming to dinner.

As a reminder, remember that the apostrophe STOPS the effect of a capitalized word indicator. What does that mean? You must repeat the capitalized word indicator (dot 6, dot 6) right after an apostrophe if the word is capitalized.

## **EXAMPLE**

O'BRIAN'S restaurant is an incredible place to eat!
