

## Weekly Dose Crossed-Out Word

Use a transcriber-defined typeform indicator to show a crossed-out word.

## Transcriber-defined typeform indicators

**RULE** Use transcriber-defined typeform indicators for significant print typeform changes other than italics, boldface, underlining or script. An example of this would be when print shows a cross out in words.

Make sure to follow these guidelines when you run into this type of formatting.

- List the transcriber-defined typeform indicator on the special symbols page
- Explain the usage in a transcriber's note

**Example:** I have decided on the blue ~~red~~ car.
