


## Weekly Dose Enough

**RULE:** The *lower wordsign*, **enough**, is used when standing alone, and unlike be, were, his, and was, it CAN be used when in contact with lower punctuation signs provided the sequence contains upper dots.

### Examples:

Far-enough 

IT'S JUST NOT ENOUGH . . . . . (Since the capitals terminator is used, it is NOT punctuation, so the *wordsign* “enough,” is used, even if it looks like you should not.)

**Reminder Rule:** The *lower wordsigns* for be, his, was, were, and enough **cannot** be used next to a slash because they must always **stand alone**.

### Example:

plenty/enough 

**RULE:** Watch out! To prevent it from being misread as "enough", do not use the lower groupsign for "en" when the letters "en" are "standing alone".

### Examples:

Chou En-lai    周 恩 来  
en route    在 途
