



## Weekly Dose Final-Letter Groupsigns Can and Cannot

Final-letter groupsigns are two-cell contractions are formed by preceding the final letter of common letter combinations by dots 46  or dots 56 .

### **Final-letter contraction CAN be used...**

- Following a letter and used in the middle or at the end of a word.
- As groupsigns ONLY.
- When they are followed by a slash.

Example [hopeless/hopeful   ]

### **CANNOT USE...**

- Following a hyphen, apostrophe, or capital indicator.
- If it would hinder recognition or pronunciation of the word.
