## Weekly Dose Following Print

In general follow print when transcribing into braille:

- Accents
- Punctuation
- Capitalization

## **Facsimile Transcription**

Follow print as fully as possible including ornamentation.

**Examples of Facsimile Transcription** 

- When the reader is responsible for editing the text.
- When the reader is studying typography.
- When the reader is studying original manuscripts.

## **Quick Reminder** Do not correct print errors.

## **Print Ornamentation**

<u>Ignore print</u> ornamentation (Used to enhance the appearance of print, some may call it, "eye candy.")

**Examples of Print Ornamentation** 

- Different typefaces or fonts for headings.
- The lowercase of letters with accents in a fully capitalized word.
- Colored type print used for all example words.
- Italics used for all variables in a text.
- Small capitals font used for all Roman numerals.
