

Weekly Dose Grade 1 Terminator Uses

RULE The grade 1 terminator usually follows immediately after the last affected symbols-sequence of a grade 1 passage.

RULE Use the grade 1 terminator when it is necessary to terminate grade 1 mode before the end of a symbols-sequence.

Example:

t-t-t-t-t-terracotta

RULE A numeric indicator also sets grade 1 mode. Grade 1 mode, when set by a numeric indicator, is terminated by a space, hyphen, dash or grade 1 terminator.

The grade 1 terminator is often used in web address.

h:\state\2020accounts

[Did you notice the grade 1 terminator was used before the word, accounts? Remember why? Well, it is used in this case because it is terminating the numeric mode. When you are in numeric mode, no contractions are to be used, however, if you terminate, contractions can be used.]
