Weekly Dose Hyphen or Dash Ends Grade 1 Mode

RULE Grade 1 mode is terminated by a hyphen or dash, thus allowing contractions to be used again. Therefore, a letter or letters that could read as a contraction will need the grade 1 indicator.

EXAMPLE

If you go 1st—will I go last?
