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Weekly Dose Groupsign, Wordsign next to the Hyphen

There are many different ways for a groupsign or wordsign can be utilized. Not to mention, how these signs can really effect if whether to contract or not to contract.

**EXAMPLE #1 Lower Groupsign** 

**RULE** Use the lower groupsign for "be", "con" or "dis" when the letters it represents form the first syllable of a word.

[In this example the lower groupsign "be" CANNOT be used because it does not form the first syllable of a word.]

**EXAMPLE #2 Lower Wordsign** 

would-be actor

Remember, it depends on how you interpret the text you are transcribing. In this example above, the lower wordsign "be" is NOT contracted because it could be confused for a semicolon.
