

## Weekly Dose NOT Standing Alone

Quick Reminder about the Standing Alone Rule. A letter or letters-sequence is considered to be "standing alone" if it is when preceded and followed by a space, a hyphen or a dash. The dash may be of any length, i.e. the dash or the long dash.

## Not standing alone when next to ...
