Definitions:

Grade 2 Braille: Braille which includes contractions.

Grade 1 braille: Braille in which contractions are not used.

Standing Alone: A letter or word (letters-sequence) is standing alone when preceded and followed by a space, a <a href="https://doi.org/10.100/ed-10.1001/journal.org/10.1001/jou

<mark>dash</mark>.

Grade 1 Symbol Indicator. Place a grade 1 symbol indicator, dots 56 (⋮), immediately before a single letter that stands alone. If the letter is capitalized, place the grade 1 symbol indicator before the capital indicator.

Examples:

X marks the spot.

RULE Do not use a grade 1 symbol indicator before the single letters a, i, and o when they are standing alone, because these letters have no contracted meaning.
