Weekly Dose Strikethrough and What to Do

QUESTION: "How should I transcribe a print word that is crossed out [strikethrough] into braille?"

ANSWER (rule 9.5.1): Use transcriber-defined typeform indicators for significant print typeform changes other than italics, boldface, underlining or script. This includes but is not limited to: different-sized type; coloured type; crossed-out type; sans serif font; and double, dotted, coloured or wavy underlining.

Don't forget to list the transcriber-defined typeform indicator on the special symbols page or in a transcriber's note giving the print typeform it represents.
