

## Weekly Dose Strikethrough and What to Do

**QUESTION:** "How should I transcribe a print word that is crossed out [strikethrough] into braille?"

**ANSWER (rule 9.5.1):** Use transcriber-defined typeform indicators for significant print typeform changes other than italics, boldface, underlining or script. This includes but is not limited to: different-sized type; coloured type; crossed-out type; sans serif font; and double, dotted, coloured or wavy underlining.

**Don't forget** to list the transcriber-defined typeform indicator on the special symbols page or in a transcriber's note giving the print typeform it represents.

**Transcriber-Defined Typeform Indicators** ⠠⠠⠠ ⠠⠠⠠ ⠠⠠⠠  
⠠⠠⠠ You would use in the order in which they would appear.
