

Weekly Dose Write-On-Lines

Write-on-Lines within Sentences

- An underscore represents a low line in print that indicates omission of a word or a blank to be filled in.
- Follow print for other symbols used to show omissions or blanks to be filled in.
- If print uses empty space to show an omission, substitute three dot 5s and insert a transcriber's note explaining the change from print.
- Punctuation is unspaced from the underscore or other symbols.

Example: Various Symbols Used to Indicate Missing Words

Vanilla ---- is my favorite dessert.

Today is _____.

It is o'clock.

My favorite color is .
