A quick overview, at a glance, of which, CAN or CANNOT, be used next to a Solidus (forward slash) :::

CANNOT

- Alphabetic wordsigns but, can, do, every, from, go, have, just, knowledge, like, more, not, people, quite, rather, so, that, us, very, will it, you, and last but not least as
- Strong wordsign: child, out, shall, still, this, which
- Lower double letter wordsigns bb, cc, dis, ea, ff, gg
- **Shortforms** the 75 shortforms

CAN

- Strong Contractions and, for, of, the with and
- Strong Groupsigns ch, ou, sh, st, th, wh
- Lower groupsigns be, con, dis, ONLY when it forms the first syllable of the letter sequence.
- Lower wordsign in
- Lower groupsigns in, en
- <u>Initial Letter Contractions and final letter groupsigns</u>
