

Weekly Dose Use of Contractions Next to the Slash

A quick overview, at a glance, of which, CAN or CANNOT, be used next to a Solidus (forward slash) ∷∷

CANNOT

- **Alphabetic wordsigns** *but, can, do, every, from, go, have, just, knowledge, like, more, not, people, quite, rather, so, that, us, very, will it, you, and last but not least as*
- **Strong wordsign**: *child, out, shall, still, this, which*
- **Lower double letter wordsigns** *bb, cc, dis, ea, ff, gg*
- **Shortforms** *the 75 shortforms*

CAN

- **Strong Contractions** *and, for, of, the with and*
- **Strong Groupsigns** *ch, ou, sh, st, th, wh*
- **Lower groupsigns** *be, con, dis, ONLY when it forms the first syllable of the letter sequence.*
- **Lower wordsign** *in*
- **Lower groupsigns** *in, en*
- **Initial Letter Contractions and final letter groupsigns**
