

Rules are essential, all the way down to the details, in the examples below, are fantastic examples to follow.

RULE 10.8.1 Use the final-letter groupsign when the letters it represents follow a **letter**, a **contraction**, a **modified letter** or a **ligatured letter** unless other rules limit its use.

“However, what does it mean when it states, other rules limit its use?”

Let's take a closer at a few examples that might explain.

EXAMPLES

- [The final-letter groupsign can't be used when next to a hyphen.]

- [The final-letter group sign can't be used when next to the underline typeform terminator.]

- [The final-letter groupsign can't be used when next to punctuation.]

- [The final-letter groupsign can't be used with the presence of an accent letter.]
