"Received material to transcribe for an elementary student, I am not sure how-to braille a timed reading when the number falls at the end of the print line?"

Great question! There is a solution to your question. Time to visit Braille Formats 2016 under section 15.8.

Counted Words

- **15.8.1** Word counts are used for timed readings and typing tests. The numbers fall at the end of the print line.
 - Treat counted words as line-numbered text, leaving three spaces at the end of each line of text.
 - Insert a transcriber's note explaining the use of the three blank cells, and that the number refers to the end of the print line.

Example: Three blank cells indicate the end of a print line. The numbers in the right margin are the number of words read at the point of the three blank cells.

```

 Insert a blank line between the transcriber's note and the beginning of the line-numbered material.
