

## Weekly Dose Spacing When a List is not a List

"Working on 4<sup>th</sup> grade worksheet, just wanted to be clear on how to format the exercise material, when each word answer is spaced far apart going left to right."

**SPACE RULE 3.23.1** A space is a blank area separating words, letters, numbers and punctuation. Whenever there is some amount of space in print, including at the end of a line, there is a **space in braille**. If there is doubt as to whether a space is present in print, **presume one is present. The amount of space present is not considered important.**

In this example below, from the *Rules of Unified English Braille*, did you notice formatting was in 1-3 with only one blank cell in between the words.

Some nouns have the same spelling for the singular and the plural:  
deer            sheep            salmon            species            Chinese
